Section 14.

General

During the reporting period no different or additional problems were encountered compared to previous reporting periods.

The format of the CC do not allow for a non-manipulation of the data, the same document can be introduced more than once and parts of the documents can be used separately. We are expecting great progress with the launching of an electronic catch registration system which will allow for a systematic follow-up of the quantities of fish products for which a certificate was issued.
