- Customs Agency, which is competent authority for customs control, authorization, suspension and denial of importation or exportation.
- Bulgarian Food Safety Agency, Directorate "Border Control" which carries out state veterinary control of imported/exported animal products.
- Directorate General "Border Police" at the Ministry of Interior, which performs control in the territorial waters and EEZ;
- Maritime administration Agency and Bulgarian Ports Infrastructure Company – these authorities are responsible for port access and granting of port services.

- 4. Usising of a uniform CC model from all third countries (eg non-use of uniform CC model by the USA, Iceland, Faroe Islands).
- 5.All third countries which issue an electronic catch certificate should create a system for online verification of certificates issued by them (good example Canada, Norway).
- 6. Unauthorized use of an electronically issued catch certificate if missed some details / possible multiple use of the same certificate in different MS /
- 7. Development of a common EU register (database) of catch certificates submitted by third countries and the possibility of online access to them.
- 8. Automatic recognition and cancellation of one catch certificate for import into the EU in different MS.
- 9. Ability to track the quantity of imported fish into EU under a catch certificate issued for a large quantity, but imported only part of it.
- 10. Existence of a list of establishments processing fish products in third countries approved by the national authorities and meeting EU food safety requirements.
