<u>Central Customs Risk assessment and local Risk analysis:</u> regarding the criteria used for risk identification, the Customs and Monopolies Agency uses a specific control circuit that allows real-time checks. These controls are based on a precise risk analysis system. Through this tool it is possible to evaluate the customs declarations submitted by the operators using specific risk profiles included in the system by the competent Central Management integrated with the indications coming from the risk analyzes prepared at the local level. Therefore, the Customs and Monopolies Agency has adopted, for carrying out controls on goods in import, export and transit, a selective methodology on all declarations (from and for third countries), based on the aforementioned risk analysis system. Through the Customs Control Circuit and the control local systems the operations are selected according to the type of control to which the declarations are submitted; the control channels provided by the system are 4 in relation to the various risk profiles possibly associated with one or more elements of the declaration (for example origin, provenance, goods, etc).:

- > red channel documentary and physical control of goods (VM);
- > orange channel document control and "scanner" verification (x-rays) of means of transport and containers (CS);
- > yellow channel documentary control of the declaration and the attached documentation (CD);
- > green channel automated control (CA).

The definition of risk profiles is monitored, predetermined and implemented on the basis of a constant intelligence activity that examines and evaluates information obtained from the verification of flows and from the consultation and crossing of data from national and EU databases. This determines a virtuous circuit that allows the entire system to adapt risk profiles in relation to the results of the checks carried out which are recorded in the information platform. This makes it possible to increase the effectiveness and selectivity of the controls, progressively reducing the quantity based on the experience gained crystallized in the results of the checks carried out.
