
EU Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreements







5) Very few States are providing information on vessel ownership details

Recommendations

The FAO...

- Expands the scope of mandatory information fields within the Global Record
- Develops automatic information-sharing mechanisms so that countries can update information more easily.
- Encourages States to submit information across <u>all information modules</u> of the Global Record and to ensure that the information submitted is <u>frequently updated</u>
- Encourages States to provide information on <u>vessel ownership</u>

Recommendations

The European Commission and partner countries...

- Seeks to develop a <u>better understanding of the barriers</u> preventing Member States and international partners from uploading the relevant data to all fields of the Global Record;
- Work together with international partner countries to <u>encourage full and timely upload</u> of information to the Global Record and the <u>uptake of IMO numbers</u> on relevant fishing vessels.
- Offer <u>financial and/or technical support</u> to partner countries (where required and appropriate) to update their national systems to facilitate mechanisms for regular information submission to the Global Record.
- Offer the FAO assistance as test partners for any information-sharing mechanism added to the Global Record.
