The format of the CC do not allow for a non-manipulation of the data, the same document can be introduced more than once and parts of the documents can be used separately. We are expecting great progress with the launching of an electronic catch registration system which will allow for a systematic follow-up of the quantities of fish products for which a certificate was issued.

We believe that the FAQ has increased the harmonization between member states, but we believe that are still some differences within the different member states regarding the implementation of the catch certification scheme.
