Centre for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment for Southwest Finland (ELY Centre) is responsible for all port inspections in accordance with Chapter II as well as catch certification scheme in accordance with Chapter III. The Single Liaison Office is the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry.

Customs are involved in the implementation after the actual IUU checks have been done by ELY Centre. Customs makes the final decision on releasing the import to free circulation after all the required checks and verifications, of which the IUU check is one. Health authorities are not directly involved but it is possible that there are joint inspections with different authorities who have duties concerning importation of fisheries products.

There are two civil servants in the Centre for Economic Development, Transport and the Environment who carry out the IUU tasks on a daily basis. In addition, there are three civil servants

who participate in the tasks to ensure undisrupted functioning of the checks and verifications also outside normal office hours and they serve also as a backup during holidays and other exceptional times.

During the review period 2020-2021, the volume of imports of fish products decreased by 18 % compared to the previous period 2018-2019. Imports of almost all major species decreased. The biggest decreases were seen in cod, almost 80 %, and redfish 38 %. Imports of significant species increased only at the point of herring. Imports of herring roughly quadrupled. The big changes in herring imports most probably relate to the structural development in the processing of canned herring for Finnish markets. Some years ago, all the processing was transferred from Finland to Poland, but again in 2019 one company started the processing and canning of Norwegian herring in Finland.
An even clearer decrease was in the number of catch certificates, which decreased by 26 %. This had a major reason in the decrease in cod imports. Cod comes from Norway in small batches fresh and these products were used in restaurants that were closed for much of the time due to the COVID pandemic
New Zealand and Thailand entered the list of third countries that imported fish products to Finland as new countries when compared to the preceding reporting period.
